

Thesis/Dissertation Format

(CEHS POLICY)

The format presented in the APA style manual (5th edition.), used by most journals in education and psychology, is the accepted one for theses and dissertations in the CEHS. However, alternative formats may be used if approved by the department and the student's supervisory committee.

To facilitate publication, the School of Graduate Studies will accept a dissertation prepared in the format of a journal to which a report of the research is to be submitted. The School of Graduate Studies has not approved the submission of a journal article in place of a thesis or dissertation, only the use of a journal format in the preparation of a thesis or dissertation.

Two or more articles that have been submitted or have been published may be used as the basis for the thesis or dissertation. The articles may be included as separate chapters with different formats if the journals differ in that regard. However, the studies must be on a common theme and there must be an inclusive abstract, an introductory problem statement that sets the context for all of the studies, a general review of literature in most cases, and a summary and conclusions chapter that integrates all of the studies or articles.
